The following reference materials will be required

The Code of the Grand Council, dated 1 October, 2008, with updates in 2013 and 2018, the 2016 version of the Officers Manual and the R & SM and SEM Rituals. These are available from your Recorder. If you want a copy for yourself, they can be purchased, for a small fee, from the Grand Recorder.

Because of the limited number of resource materials, a Council may want to accomplish a group session, which is fine, however, each companion will need to submit the quiz on line.

I encourage everyone to take the course, especially if you are a Companion interested in servicing as an officer. Hopefully, this will convince you of becoming the Illustrious Master of your Council.


