Grand Council of Ohio Overview of the 2022 Annual Assembly

The 193rd Annual Assembly of the Grand Council of Ohio took place on October 2-4, 2022 at the Kalahari Resort in Sandusky, Ohio.

The Assembly began on Sunday night with a meet and greet hosted by the Grand Master, Most Illustrious Companion David G. Weimer and lady Laura. After the meet and greet the companions and ladies enjoyed hospitality in the various Arch hospitality rooms.

The business session of the 193rd Annual Assembly began on Monday with the required quorum of the 82 Ohio Councils in attendance. The Grand Officers were introduced as well as the 13 Past Grand Masters from Ohio in attendance for this Assembly. Visiting dignitaries from the jurisdictions of Kentucky, Indiana, Michigan, Ontario, Delaware, General Grand Council and Prince Hall Royal and Select Masters of Ohio were introduced and all were made Honorary Members of the Grand Council of Ohio. In attendance were William Snyder, G. Thomas Taylor and David Grindle from the General Grand Council Cryptic Masons, International. There was an informative presentation by MI Gary Wyne regarding the CMMRF. Committee Reports were then presented in a fine manner and all legislation was quickly addressed for this session. The annual election of officers was conducted and Rite Illustrious Companion Michael L. Terry was elected the Grand Master for Ohio for the 2022-2023 year. Lunch was provided for Men and Ladies with entertainment during the lunch. After lunch, the Order of the Silver Trowel was conferred on all current and past Illustrious Masters. For those not eligible for the Order of the Silver Trowel, a School of Instruction was conducted which reviewed fine points of the ritual and code. Both events were well attended by the Companions.

The Grand Banquet was held at the Kalahari Resort Monday night and was a delicious meal with 170 companions and ladies in attendance. During the banquet there were presentations from representatives of our youth organizations (Rainbow Girls, Jobs Daughters and DeMolay). We also heard from Scottish Rite NMJ, Order of the Eastern Star, Prince Hall Masons of Ohio and the Grand Lodge of Ohio. After the banquet the hospitality rooms were then available for additional networking.

On Tuesday, October 4th the annual meeting of the Grand Council Benevolent Fund took place with a review of the fund and distribution of the funds to the Diabetic Kids Camps for 2023.

After the annual meeting, Grand Council was resumed for the purpose of unfinished business and installation of officers. The officers for 2022-2023 were installed in proper form. The 194th Annual Assembly of the Grand Council of Ohio will take place in Dayton, Ohio on September 14-16, 2023.

Ohio Council of Anointed Kings Report

The Council met on Tuesday October 3 rd at the Kalahari Resort in Sandusky Ohio. There were 27 candidates for the Order of the Silver Trowel. The Degree was presented at 1:30 P.M.. The cast did an excellent conferral of the ritual, with the candidates receiving a very good degree. That day we presented their permanent Dues cards.
